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PRAYER POD GUIDE



Forming a **Prayer Pod**

Consider who you could meet and pray with on a weekly basis.

2 Be open to inviting someone you don't know and who may be looking for a pod to join.

3 Reach out to people by phone, text, in person, or email and invite them to be part of your Prayer Pod.



Officially form a prayer pod group of 3-6 other people (2 family units minimum + kids).



Prayer Pod **Tasks**

Identify the **point person** for the group to receive any additional information from the church office. The point person is to **turn in the Prayer Pod Members card** (contained in your packet), to the 40 Days of Prayer table in the main lobby, identifying who is in the group. This can also be done online on the 40 Days of Prayer page on pearcechurch.org.

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As a pod, meet **once a week for 5 weeks to pray for 15-30 minutes**. Each week has a prayer focus and scriptures to reflect on. Allow the Lord to guide your thoughts and prayers. Use this time to also pray for and encourage each other.

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Schedule a time as a pod to meet up and do a **prayer walk** together around the Pearce facility, Roberts/NES campus, or the North Chili Community. The pod's point person will need to submit the Prayer Walk card once that is decided to the 40 Days of Prayer table in the main lobby or online. A guide will be in your packet to help you as you walk and pray.

As a group, consider signing up to pray for a worship service on one of the 6 weekends throughout the 40 Days of Prayer. Meet as a group (Friendship Center -Saturdays; Parlor - Sundays) and use the provided guide to pray throughout the worship service for God to move, speak to hearts, the anointing of the Spirit on the pastor and worship leaders, unity, protection from the enemy, response of the congregation, effectiveness of the Word, KidsMin and Youth Ministries, etc.



Other things to consider...





Worship with the church body, on time, in-person, or virtually, every week.

For those who are able, consider fasting for 2 meals a week to help you draw nearer to God.





Consider how you can give to the Lord a tithe of 10% of what you have been given

Find one new way to serve others either inside or outside the church.

Focus

The healing of hurts and breaking of strongholds within the Pearce family, including any hint of racism, pride, selfishness, or self-sufficiency

Scripture

"Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. I will be found by you," declares the LORD.

-Jeremiah 29:12-14a

Focus

Focus

Scripture

Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for whoever loves others has fulfilled the law. Scripture
